Entering Tonight's Match

The Hokies enter the match 14-3-2 overall ... Cincinnati is 13-5-5 on the season ... Tech is ranked 14th in the NCSAA poll and ninth in the TopDrawerSoccer.com polls ... Virginia Tech is a fourth seed in the NCAA Tournament.

Last Time Out: Notre Dame 3, Virginia Tech 0

The Hokies ended the regular season with a 3-0 loss at No. 14 Notre Dame on Oct 30 ... The Hokies finished the regular season fifth in the ACC.

Chugging Right Along

Virginia Tech head coach, **Charles "Chugger" Adair**, is now in his fifth season at the helm ... He has a 76-28-7 overall record (.716) and a 28-21-4 record in ACC competition (.566) ... He is 8-4 (.667) in NCAA Tournament matches ... A full bio is available on page 4 of this release.

All-ACC

Senior **Ashley Meier** and junior **Murielle Tiernan** have been named first team All-ACC in a vote by the league coaches ... Senior **Jordan Coburn** was named to the league's third team ... This is the first time two Virginia Tech women's soccer players have been named to the first team in the same season.

The Hokies vs. Cincinnati

This is the first meeting between the Hokies and the Bearcats ... Tech is 9-3-1 all-time against schools currently in the American Athletic Conference.

Hokies in the National Stats

Murielle Tiernan is seventh nationally in game-winning goals ... She is 17th nationally in goals per game and 22nd nationally in total goals ... She is 31st in points per game ... **Jordan Coburn** is 66th in total assists and 56th in assists per game ... As a team, the Hokies are 18th in won-loss percentage, 24th in total goals, 18th in scoring offense, 30th in total points and 28th in points per game.

Virginia Tech in the NCAA Tournament

This is the Hokies' eighth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament ... In the seven previous appearances, Tech is 10-7 ... This is the Hokies' ninth overall appearance in the NCAA Tournament, with a 10-8 overall mark ... The Hokies made their first NCAA appearance in the 2004 season, falling in the first round, 2-1, to William & Mary in Chapel Hill ... All eighth of Tech's previous NCAA appearances have come since joining the ACC in 2004.

Seniors **Ashley Meier** and **Jordan Coburn** have been named to the 2015 CoSIDA Academic All-District 3 second team, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America ... Academic All-District Team honors the nation's top student-athletes for their performances in both athletics and in the classroom ... This is the first such honor for both Coburn or Meier ... Each have earned numerous other academic honors throughout their collegiate careers ... Both student-athletes will graduate in May.

The senior from Midlothian, Virginia also spends here time working for HokieVision, as one of the on-camera talent for the Virginia Tech video productions ... Last spring, she worked as a sideline reporter for HokieVision's ESPN3 broadcasts and on Oct. 23, she was the color analyst for the ESPN3 production of the Hokies' men's soccer match against defending national champion, Virginia, one night after playing in a 0-0 draw against defending national champion Florida State.

Murielle's Big Week

Murielle Tiernan earned many accolades for her play during the season's first weekend of action in the Hokies' victory in the Hoosier Classic ... Tiernan, who scored three of Tech's four goals on the weekend, was named the National Player of the Week by both espnW and TopDrawerSoccer.com ... She was also named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week.

Thank You, Seniors

This season's senior class for the Hokies consists of five players, **Ashley Meier, Jordan Coburn, Morgan Conklin, Courtney Stutts** and **Delia Maresco** ... This talented quintet enters tonight's match with an overall record of 62-20-6, for a .739 winning percentage ... This group has also made the NCAA Tournament in all four of their seasons and has a 5-2-1 NCAA Tournament record ... This group is the ninth-winningest senior class in Division I this season with 62 victories.

Murielle is the Tops!

Virginia Tech junior forward, **Murielle Tiernan**, scored Tech's second goal of the Longwood match and in doing so, recorded her 30th career goal ... After a goal in the Hokies' win against Pittsburgh, she now has 38 career goals ... That puts her alone in first place on the Virginia Tech all-time goals list ... In the loss to No. 3 UNC, Tiernan scored her 32nd goal and in doing so, set a new school record for career points ... She now has 89 career points and is tied for eighth in career assists, with 13.

Ashley's Not Far Behind

Virginia Tech senior midfielder, **Ashley Meier**, scored her 28th career goal in Tech's win over Davidson and now has 30 career goals ... That puts her alone in second place on the Virginia Tech all-time goals list, behind teammate **Murielle Tiernan** ... Meier enters tonight's match in third place in career points, with 73 ... Meier has 186 career shots, third place on Virginia Tech's all-time list.

On the Injury Front

The Hokies will be without outstanding freshman **Kelsey Irwin**, who suffered a torn ACL over the summer and will miss the 2015 season ... She is expected to be ready to practice during the spring after earning a medical redshirt ... Tech has also lost redshirt sophomore **Jordyn Brock** to a torn ACL, suffered in the win over UNC Greensboro ... She will miss the remainder of the season.

Senior Watch

Senior **Ashley Meier** was named a preseason All-ACC selection in a vote by the league coaches ... Meier was third in goals and points ... In the same poll, the Hokies have been picked fifth in the ACC.

Our Newest Hokie

Head coach **Chugger Adair** relied heavily on associate head coach **Drew Kopp** and assistant coach **Matt Gwilliam** prior to the win over Duke, for a very good reason ... Last month, Adair and his wife, **Shelbylynn**, welcomed the birth of their their second child, son **Austin Tate Adair** ... Shelbylynn is the associate head coach on the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

Some Interesting Numbers

With the Hokies' 4-2 win over Pittsburgh on Sunday, Virginia Tech is now 62-0 all-time when scoring four-or-more goals ... The four goals scored by the Hokies is tied for the most against an ACC opponent this season, tying the four goals scored against Duke on Oct. 4 ... The four goals scored against No. 22 Duke on Oct. 4 is the most goals Tech has scored against a nationally-ranked team since Sept. 5, 2014, when the Hokies defeated No. 13 Georgetown, 6-1, at Thompson Field.

Representing the U.S.A.

Virginia Tech senior **Ashley Meier** spent a portion of her summer representing her country for US Soccer ... The U-23 Women's National Team came away with two wins and one draw in winning the 2015 Four Nations Tournament in Sarpsborg, Norway ... Meier has been a member of the national team pools since she was 12 years old and was a member of the U18 US National Team ... She was the 2011 NSCAA High School National Player of the Year and a two-time high school All-American ... Meier received the Ohio's "Ms. Soccer" and State of Ohio Player of the Year awards her senior year ... Off the pitch, Meier is a three-time ACC All-Academic Team selection and a two-time ACC Honor Roll selection ... She has been named to Dean's List in Spring 2014, Fall 2013, Spring 2013 and Fall 2012.

Statistical Housekeeping

In checking back on the game final from the win at VCU, Virginia Tech's **Murielle Tiernan** should have been awarded an assist on the goal by Laila Gray in the 66th minute of play ... Also, in the win over JMU, the Hokies' second goal was originally credited to **Ashley Meier** ... The coaches reviewed the game film and it was obvious that the goal should be credited to **Murielle Tiernan**, with an assist to Meier ... The stats have been adjusted.

On the List

Murielle Tiernan named to the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Award watch list ... Tiernan is one of 28 student-athletes on the list and one of eight players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools ... Tiernan led the Hokies in goals, assists and scoring last season ... The MAC Hermann Award Trophy is the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer presented annually to one male and one female athlete.

Hoosier Honors

Juniors **Murielle Tiernan** and **Candace Cephers**, along with senior **Ashley Meier**, were named to the all-tournament team at the Hoosier Classic during the first weekend of the season.

Tough Slate

This season's schedule featured a host of quality non-conference opponents along with the always-tough ACC slate ... Six opponents earned NCAA Tournament berths last season ... The Hokies won their first match against a ranked opponent, 2-1 over No. 12/10 West Virginia on Sunday, Aug. 23 in Bloomington, Indiana.

Scoring in Bunches

Virginia Tech is continuing its offensive success after last season's team scored 62 goals, the most in program history while only allowing 18 goals ... The high-powered offense and steady defense earned the Hokies 15 wins of at least a two-goal margin, including the first 10 games of the season ... In all, four of the team's top five scorers from last season return to the lineup this season ... Fourteen players scored goals last season; 10 of those players return for the Hokies ... To date, the Hokies are averaging 2.3 goals per match, slightly behind the pace of last season ... To date, Tech has scored at least two goals in 15 of the 19 matches.

What is a Hokie?

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell, which is still used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell ... It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Head Coach Chugger Adair



Charles "Chugger" Adair has wasted little time in making the Virginia Tech women's soccer program one of the top in the Atlantic Coast Conference and one of the best nationally.

In his five seasons at Virginia Tech, he has posted a 76-28-7 overall record, good for a sterling .716 winning percentage. During that time he has also won 28 of 53 ACC contests.

Promoted to head coach on Dec. 7, 2010, as the replacement for Kelly

Cagle, who resigned for family reasons, Adair has continued the upward trajectory of Tech women's soccer in the ACC, culminating in 2013 when he guided the Hokies to a record-setting season. Tech won a school record 19 games, advanced to the finals of the ACC Tournament and later advanced to the NCAA College Cup.

In the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, making it seven straight NCAA appearances. During the regular season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62 and fewest goals allowed in a season, with just 18.

The 2013 season was an exciting one for Tech. The Hokies advanced to the NCAAs for the sixth straight time and seventh time in school history largely because of an exciting offense and stellar defense and goalkeeping.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since then.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks.

He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. He moved from there and spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, the associate head volleyball coach at Virginia Tech, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn and a son, Austin Tate, born on Oct. 2. He also has two other daughters, Alexandra and Madeline, and a son, Jack.
